"Depression has a major effect on quality of life for the patient and affects family members, especially children," the group noted in its report.

• Do you agree with the above statement? Why or why not?

"In the United States, like many other economically developed nations, primary care practices represent the best place for implementation of these methods, because it is the only venue where both screening and, if clinically indicated, treatment can be provided," Michael Thase, a professor of psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania, wrote in an editorial accompanying the publication of the guidelines.

• Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?

The report recommends screening each adult at least once, but notes the "optimal frequency of such screening has not been established."

Thase suggested "for patients in generally good health who only see their primary-care physicians sporadically, it may make sense to screen at each visit" and possibly to "incorporate periodic Web-based 'health checks.' "
