Ohio State University criminal-law professor Ric Simmons said he doubts a charge of child endangering could be proved in this instance, because the offense typically involves leaving a youngster unattended for an extended time, not a case of a child momentarily wandering off.

"The mother was standing next to a zoo exhibit and lost track of her child for perhaps a minute or so," Simons said in an email. "That has happened to almost every parent in the world in a public place."
