Objectives:

Students will discuss guaranteed income and whether it makes sense or not. They'll learn what it is and how pilot programs across our country are rolling out programs to help those close or at poverty levels in local communities. They will think about deeper questions from their own perspectives-Has racism and capitalism intersected to steal wealth from some communities, creating the disparities we see today? Opponents argue that guaranteed income programs are too expensive and are counterproductive-students will be asked for their thoughts.
