1. _____ was derived from støbtabel' (stub-tahb-elh), or grizzly bear, in the Lushootseed language spoken by the Upper Skagit people who lived on these lands for at least 10,000 years. (MAIN)
2. Lava erupts early Saturday from snow-covered _____ in Sicily, Italy. Europe's most active volcano scattered ashes around the populated areas along its slopes. (MAIN)
3. One of the world's largest icebergs is drifting beyond Antarctic waters, after being grounded for more than three decades, according to the British Antarctic Survey. The iceberg, known as _____, split from the Antarctic's Filchner Ice Shelf in 1986. But it became stuck to the ocean floor and had remained for many years in the Weddell Sea. The iceberg is three times the size of New York City and more than twice the size of Greater London, measuring around 1,500 square miles. (MAIN)

China has repeatedly stunned the U.S. intelligence community in the last five years with rapid progress in its space exploration program, landing a rover on the far side of the moon and completing its very own space station orbiting Earth. Its advances have established that a new space race is on between the U.S. and China — this time with the ultimate goal of what? (MAIN)
5. In final Pac-12 Apple Cup, rivals put on another classic and UW reaches _____-_____. (SPORTS)

This past week, the Ludwig Institute for Shared Economic Prosperity analyzed what it calls the "true living cost" for 50 cities — adding up big-ticket items such as housing and child care, but also food, health care, transportation, technology like internet access, and personal household items. The goal was to estimate the minimum of what it takes to make it, on a modest budget, in places around the country. Incredibly, it's now in the six figures for a family of four in Seattle — about \$_____. That's up more than 80% since 2005, which ranks us No. 1 for fastest rising cost of living, ahead of Honolulu.
